The water bends around Narrowsburg, New York. It weaves beneath an arching bridge, past shops and restaurants, galleries and homes. Just beyond some nesting eagles, the river dips behind the trees. /// Located in the Town of Tusten, this small hamlet is proud of its scenic beauty and cultural scene. It's a place where you can hike, fish, hunt, and raft, as well as engage with a thriving community of artists, entrepreneurs, and devoted volunteers. /// Whether you're just visiting or call this place home, this field guide is for you. Explore the history, businesses, and events of our quaint rural enclave. This is Narrowsburg...and we're glad you're here!





A FEW THINGS ABOUT **THE RIVER**

Nothing defines Narrowsburg like the river that has shaped the surrounding ecology and economy for generations. It sustains wildlife and residents, lures anglers, and inspires artists. It's what makes this place special.

At 330 miles, the Delaware River is the longest free-flowing river in the Northeastern United States. The rushing water spans five different states (Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York, Maryland, and Delaware) and provides drinking water to more than 13 million people. It begins with two branches that flow from the Catskills Mountains. Float downstream long enough, past Trenton and Philadelphia, and you'll eventually get swallowed by the Atlantic Ocean.

The Delaware gets narrowest just under the Narrowsburg bridge, giving our hamlet its name. The lake-like eddy that curls up against Main Street is 113 feet deep. Perfect for swimming and kayaking, it is a picturesque reprieve before the river snakes onward over Class I and Class II rapids.

Upriver and downriver, the waters carry rafts past campsites, homes, and long serene stretches of nothing but trees and the wildlife within them. The Delaware River Basin is home to

The best eagle-viewing spots are Narrowsburg's Main Street observation deck or any of the designated rest stops along Route 97.



90 different types of fish, including trout and bass. More than 400 species of birds share our home, drawing binoculared birdwatchers from miles around. Bald eagles, in particular, return to the same nesting sites in Narrowsburg year after year, especially during the spring and summer months.

Recent conservation efforts have led to an increase in eagle numbers in our area, making it one of the most reliable year-round nesting areas in New York State. From scenic roads, observation decks, and riverbanks, you can see these majestic creatures soaring overhead and hunting from their riverside perches, snagging fish from the surface, before returning to their nests.

SK: Plan, plan, plan, and prepare. When you're on the river, make sure you stay hydrated and have plenty of sunblock. A lot of times we get folks who don't realize that they're in a very remote area. There's not good cell phone service. So it's important to make a float plan. Tell someone where you're going, and when you expect to return. Wearing a life jacket is the most important equipment you can bring, and be sure to wear it even while swimming; it will save your life!

WATER WAYS

Lander's River Trips rents kayaks, canoes, and rafts. They also offer tubing trips with buses that deliver you back to your car.

River rocks are slippery. Watch your step.

Respect private property rights. Make sure you use public access points at the beginning and end of your river trips.

FISHING LICENSES ARE REQUIRED FOR ANGLERS 16 AND OLDER. PURCHASE LOCALLY AT TOM'S BAIT AND TACKLE IN PETE'S PLAZA.

Plan ahead for a way to take your garbage with you when you leave the river.

GET OUTSIDE

You never have to go far to enjoy the natural beauty around here. Within minutes from Narrowsburg's Main Street, there are hiking trails, boat launches, eagle observatories, swimming holes, and other adventurous ways to enjoy the fresh air and explore the area.

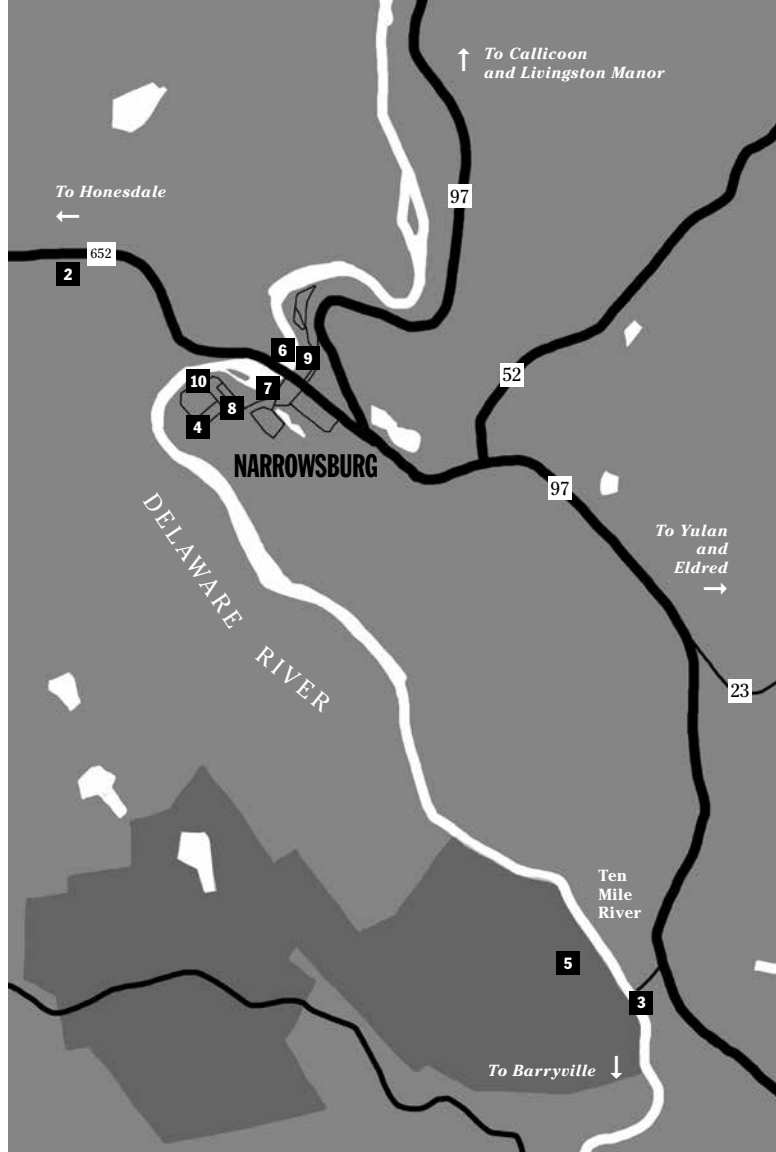

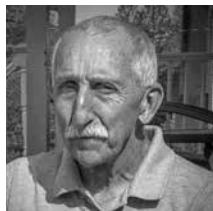
BECOMING NARROWSBURG

There have been many names for this place. It was first called Lenapehoking (“home of the Lenape”) by the region’s original Native American inhabitants. For thousands of years, Lenape tribes lived in dozens of autonomous villages throughout the Delaware River Valley. After Dutch and Swedish traders arrived, the community of Ten Mile River was settled in 1757, about five miles downriver from Main Street today. Our inlet off the Delaware River was first dubbed Homans’ Eddy, after one of the area’s earliest white settlers. It eventually became the town of Big Eddy before embracing its final moniker: Narrowsburg.

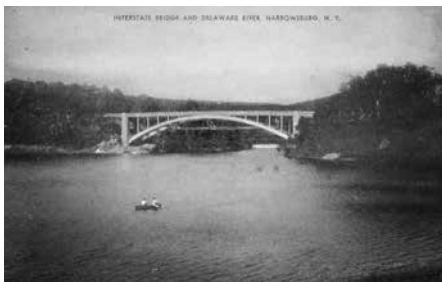

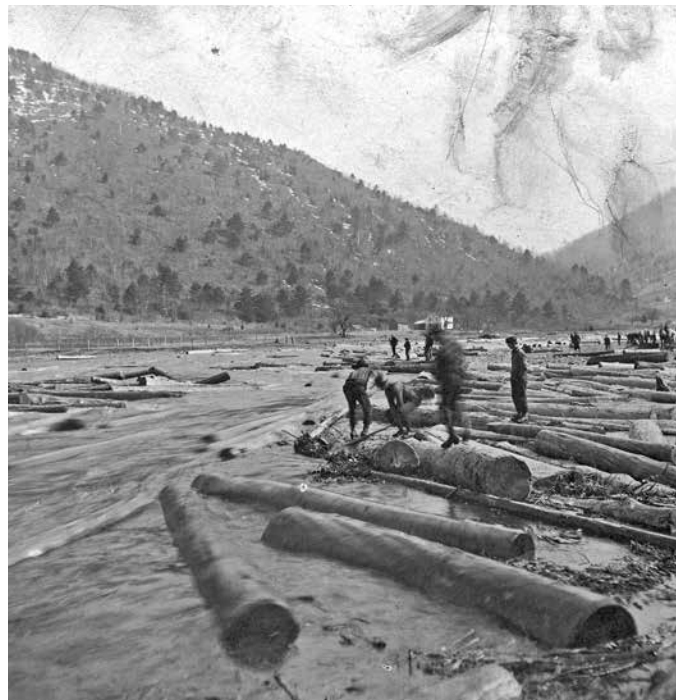
AH: Every place has its history. And, you know, history is meant to be preserved. It's meant to be shared. It gives you a sense of identity. Since the 1920s, the town was really built by volunteers that left their imprint on the development of Narrowsburg. The Chamber of Commerce, hunting clubs, the fire department, and other service organizations were highly instrumental. If you're new in the area, it's important to learn about what went on, what was here before.



The Erie Railroad first brought tourism to this countryside getaway. In 1848, a locomotive brought the first passenger train to town. Within a year, the lure of hunting, fishing, and rural escapism drew urban dwellers from New York City and Philadelphia on a daily basis. The railroad continued passenger service into the 1900s, but now operates only as a freight corridor.



Narrowsburg's iconic arched iron bridge was built in 1953.



Logging drove the local economy for 150 years. Miles upstream, workers cut and floated tall oak, pine, and chestnut trees down the river. They used oars to navigate these tethered rafts over treacherous rapids before selling the lumber in cities such as Trenton and Philadelphia. Some had to hike more than a hundred miles home on foot before repeating the journey. Hotels and taverns were built along the riverbanks to accommodate the needs of these raftsmen. Narrowsburg's thin passage caused some of the worst traffic jams on the Delaware River, but its pool of calm water also gave respite for weary travelers.

LOCAL INSPIRATION

Our community attracts creatives of all kinds, thanks to a lively mix of art spaces, gardens, stages, and cultural institutions. Since 1976, our hamlet has been anchored by the Delaware Valley Arts Alliance, a nonprofit organization that provides cultural programming in the historic Arlington Hotel and the renovated Tusten Theatre. Other art-filled spaces are now scattered throughout our streets, including The Ruffed Grouse Gallery, River Gallery, The Mildred Complex(ity), the 108, and the Narrowsburg Union's exhibitions and digital gallery, among other storefronts and studios.

The talented individuals that call Narrowsburg home are deeply embedded in all aspects of community life. When they are not starting local businesses or working in our shops, restaurants, and community organizations, they are contributing to a year-round schedule of live concerts, book readings, art exhibitions, theatrical performances, live drawing sessions, and festivals that puts Narrowsburg at the center of creative expression in the Delaware Valley region.

TG: My family has been on this farm since 1982. Local agriculture is vital to every single rural community, all across America. It's the lifeblood of our country.

IB: Having the fresh fruits, vegetables, and eggs at home and in restaurants, that helps you cook more in tune with the seasons.

TG: Yeah, the sooner you can get something from the farm to the table the better.

IB: And it tastes better!

Home to bakers and beekeepers, coffee roasters and cocktail bars, this is a community that attracts foodies and food makers.

There are hundreds of working farms in Sullivan County, New York, one of the state's largest producers of poultry and eggs. Grass-fed beef, organic produce, and other fresh agricultural products from nearby fields are the foundation of a sought-after culinary scene in Narrowsburg and its surrounding towns.

Our restaurants are casual and inclusive, with menus that pay homage to our area's generational farming and deep connection to the river and soil. These establishments in and around the Town of Tusten provide visitors and residents with more than a memorable brunch, lunch, dinner, or drinks; they are vital hubs for our tight-knit communities.

From May 20 to October 28, the **Narrowsburg Farmers Market** hosts vendors selling fresh seasonal produce, artisanal foods, bakery items, and other locally-made products. The market is held every Saturday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. next to the Narrowsburg Union.

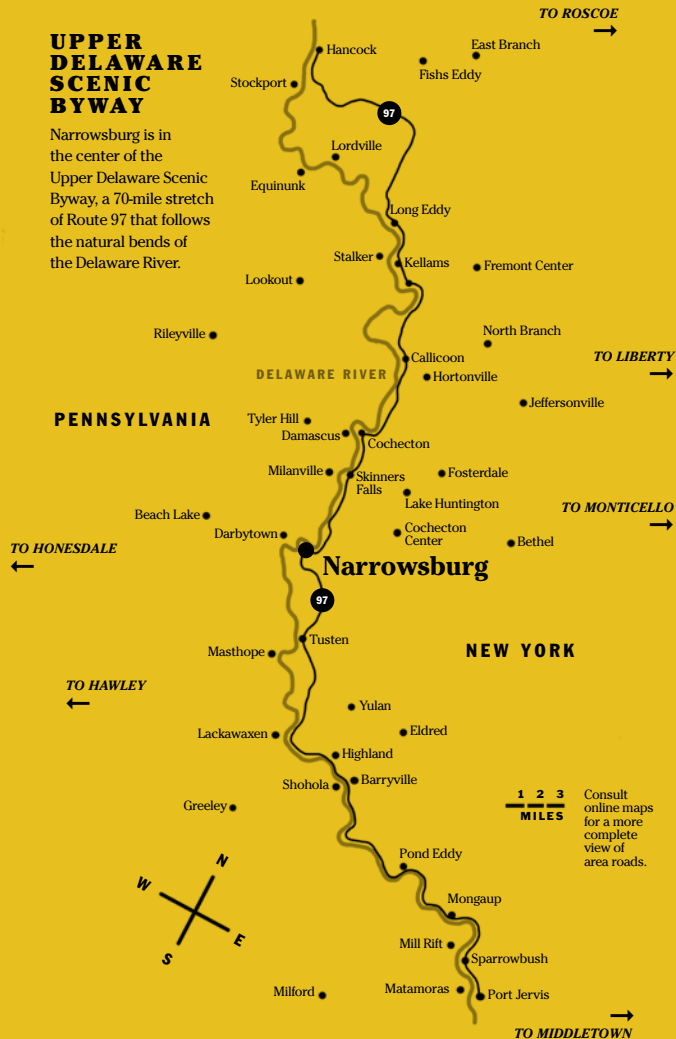
